Monroe Street Cemetery is the resting place of over 400 veterans of the Civil War, as well as an avid abolitionist who spoke at a memorial after John Brown was hanged, the operator of a stop on the Underground Railroad, the leader of the Fugitives' Aid Society of Cleveland, and even a Confederate soldier. So come take a walk with us through this beautiful, 160-year-old, historic cemetery, and meet some of the neighbors such as Dr. Walter Prentice, whose surgical skills on the battlefield were considered rare; Jacob Rauch who died at Gettysburg but whose legacy lasted into the 1970s; and the Scarr Family that lost two sons in the War. Hear about Camp Cleveland, the U.S. General Hospital and the GAR Monument. Come MEET THE NEIGHBORS!
